Situation Update

- Standards currently in use
 - Determine capability "not" preparedness
 - Combine varying aspects of key processes
 - Mitigation, Preparedness, Response & Recovery
 - Prevention (Terrorism Based)
 - Define de-centralized requirements
 - Emergency Management
 - Public Health

Combine both self-evaluation and assessment

Implied Standards

- Requirements vs. Acceptance
 - Participation (voluntary)
 - Funding
 - Recognition
 - Accreditation or Certification
 - Economics
 - Reduced or preferred rates
 - Legal
 - Accepted or established processes



Modifications / Creation

- Establish working group(s) to focus stove piped standards
 - National Emergency Management Association (NEMA)
 - State and County
 - Public Health organizations
 - State and County
 - U.S. DHS and FEMA
 - ASTM

Modifications / Creation

- Develop a consistent framework for nationalized standards and assessment
 - Provide centralized standards metrics
 - Provide cross-over compliance
 - USDHS EMAP ASTM CDC
 - Implement established assessment processes nationally
 - Establish consistent accreditation and review schedules

Modifications / Creation

- Consistent metrics for jurisdictions

 Comprehensive "all-agency" standards
- Incorporate comprehensive disaster planning elements
- Cross-over assessment of key metrics and deliverables
 Direction and Control. Communications, of

Focus on preparedness and capability

Value of Modification

- Recognition of assessment and improvement mechanisms/processes
- Recognition by national/international organizations of standards
- Reduction in expenditures from multirequirement systems
- Reduction in staff commitments from multi-requirement systems

Value of Modification

- Collaborative network for accreditation and certification by jurisdictions
 - Regional partnerships
 - Multi-echelon partnerships
- Consistent typing and application of resources, data, and agreements
- Leveraging of limited funding streams
- Leveraging of networks to promote improvement and sustainment
