



Common Evaluation Characteristics

NCQA evaluation will include:

- Common privacy and security characteristics
 across all products
- Credible design elements that instill trust in users of our information
- **Data** that enables value-based purchasing
- The trust of regulators (NCQA is experienced at evaluating key consumer protections and collecting and assessing quality information)

Future Evaluation Priorities

- Disease management vendors
- Pharmaceutical benefit managers
- Point of care solutions (hand-held computers)
- E-business standards for health plans
- Health Internet sites

Evaluation Priorities

Priorities reflect

- Disaggregated units of the health care system
- Need for better data to improve care
- Need for efficiency in health care delivery
- Move towards consumer-driven system



Common Areas

- Privacy, confidentiality
- Handling of advertising, sponsorships
- Use of clinical evidence
- Opportunities for patient feedback
- Patient safety
- Use of data



Privacy, Confidentiality

- NCQA's HMO and PPO standards currently require:
 - Confidentiality policies and procedures reviewed by designated internal committee
 - Contracts with providers state expectations about confidentiality of member information and records



Privacy, Confidentiality (cont.)

- Member-identifiable information shared with employers only with specific consent from members
- Policies shared with prospective members
- Policies on access to medical records and member medical information shared with members and providers



Future Standards

- Future standards may address:
 - Security (NCQA currently does HEDIS® audits and licenses audit organizations)
 - Privacy
 - Information used for intended purpose
 - Consumer disclosure statement
 - Informed consent
 - Right to access and amend information
 - Record of disclosures



Future Compliance

- NCQA is committed to facilitating the efficient exchange of electronic data to improve health and protect privacy
- Standards for all types of health care organizations will need to be compliant with HIPAA
- NCQA will need to be HIPAA compliant (e.g. HEDIS and survey data)
- NCQA believes there will be opportunities to combine HIPAA compliance reviews with other NCQA reviews



Related concerns

- Beyond areas strictly covered by HIPAA, the proliferation of electronic health information raises concerns
 - Disease Management scientific basis; qualifications of staff; issues related to advertising; sponsorships; patient safety; uses of data
 - Point of Care Solutions scientific basis; issues related to advertising; sponsorships; patient safety; uses of data
 - PBMS scientific basis; patient safety; uses of data




