Panel Overview

Advanced primary care is a key feature, if not a foundational element, of many accountable care organizations (ACOs). Many ACOs have been able to achieve advanced primary care through implementation of a patient-centered medical home (PCMH) or a similar delivery model. Many of the same principles guide the missions of ACOs and PCMHS, including a focus on coordinated, comprehensive, patient-centered care that improves quality and control health care costs. While PCMHs and ACOs share these core characteristics, thought leadership on the two models has not always aligned and been full leveraged to create complimentary and reinforcing patient care delivery. This panel will focus on understanding the similarities, differences and benefits of various advanced primary care approaches, how they can be translated to ACO implementation and practice, and ways in which ACO and PCMH efforts can reinforce each other in delivery systems. Panelists will discuss their experiences implementing advanced primary care in ACOs and other delivery models and what lessons can be learned for other organizations undertaking similar efforts.

Core Questions

- What steps are necessary for aligning the goals of patient-centered medical homes (PCMHs) and other primary care focused initiatives with ACOs and other alternative payment and delivery model?
- What are the major features of successful advanced primary care and how can ACOs accelerate implementation of these features?
- What impact will ongoing payment reform efforts, including the recent SGR fix and HHS payment reform goals, have on adoption of advanced primary care models?
- What strategies can health care organizations undertake to better disseminate lessons learned, share best practices, and continue scaling their delivery reform efforts?
- How long does it take for a provider organization to see a return on investment from their practice transformation strategies?
- What approaches have been used to assess cost reduction?
- How has your organization overcome barriers to implementing technology that hold the potential to enable real-time data transfer?

She will also discuss opportunities to integrate social services and other non-traditional care approaches into health care delivery models.

Topics include leveraging existing and building new care team relationships, managing referral patterns, and developing strategies for developing more patient-focused care practices.

Additionally, she will discuss the development of a team-based model of care, better health risk assessments and improved patient engagement.
