## -- CER specifically -- rarely highest priority



## Agreement:

The public / their constituents don't know what CER is. They think it's already governing what's available



## Among interviewees, knowledge about CER ranged from very high to negligible



Leaders' experience with patient involvement in research similarly variable



## Worries / concerns about CER found mostly among large, disease-specific groups



## Among those familiar with CER, strong positions, good illustrations of pros and cons
