

Protect Yourself

- Evacuate
- If you stay, be part of a team
 - Organized structure
 - Regular Drills
 - Defined Resources

Protect Your Family

- Evacuate
- Don't keep them with you
 - They cause you worry
 - They consume resources
 - Their poop also adds to the waste removal problem

Protect Your Practice

- Take your server with you
- Business interruption insurance
- Locate your staff, and pay them to stay with you
- Electronic Records with Storage off site
- Have Good Insurance (Including Flood)
- Be a leader

National Policy Change

- Amend or Suspend the Stafford Act in Declared Disaster
 - Stafford Act forbids the Federal Government from giving any help to private business.

National Policy Change

- Give assistance directly to individual and bypass the state government
 - The state infrastructure has been destroyed
 - The state is competing with you for recovery resources

National Policy Change

- Eliminate elected officials from the decision making process
- Elected officials govern by consensus, trying to be politically correct
- In a disaster, there is no time for consensus building
- Someone needs to be in charge, with the authority to make decisions

Survive

- Register with FEMA immediately
- Call your insurer immediately
- Apply for benefits immediately
- Accept Charity (Swallow your pride, you ain't Superman)

Recover

- Make a decision on what you'll do
- There's no way to know what is right or wrong. Just make a decision and move forward.
