Federal – Health Information Technology Initiatives

- American Health Information Community (AHIC) established the *Confidentiality, Privacy, and Security Workgroup* July 2006
- National Committee on Vital and Health Statistics (NCVHS) presented Secretary Leavitt with a letter of recommendations regarding *Privacy and Confidentiality in the Nationwide Health Information Network*
- AHIC Biosurveillance Workgroup to develop materials for protection of patient confidentiality 30 Sept 2006



Federal – Health Information Technology Initiatives cont....

- Certification Commission on Healthcare Information Technology (CCHIT) has developed criteria for confidentiality of PHI in the review process
- Under HHS contract, 33 states have contracted to conduct an analysis of current privacy and security practices and laws to identify variations that affect HIE
 - > Develop best practices
 - > Proposed solutions
 - > Develop implementation plans for future HIE efforts
- Pending legislation H.R. 4157
