Mission

To improve the quality, safety, efficiency, and effectiveness of health care for all Americans

Relationship to other HHS research divisions:

- NIH -- basic biomedical bench research and "efficacy" clinical trials
- AHRQ -- the healthcare delivery system and "effectiveness" of healthcare services
- CDC -- the public health system and community-based interventions

Other federal partners – CMS (Medicare and Medicaid), HRSA (capital and resources, workforce), and ONC (collaboration and coordination on health IT)

State and Regional HIT Demonstrations

- Five-year state-based contracts:
 - Help states develop secure statewide networks
 - Ensure privacy of health information
 - Make an individuals' health information more available to health care providers
- FY04: Five states awarded \$1M/year
 - Colorado
 - Indiana
 - Rhode Island
 - Tennessee
 - Utah
 - Delaware added in FY05

AHRQ National Resource Center for Health Information Technology

- Provides technical and expert support to health IT grantees, contractors, and selected other federal grantees (HRSA, CMS, IHS)
