

Global Compliance Codes Update

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Codes consolidation process

- * In April 2018, Board mandate to consolidate the 3 EFPIA Codes into one simplified version
- * Consolidation made on a collaborative, transparent and consensual process internally and externally
 - ★ Draft sent for information before the Board approval to our main stakeholders: CPME, BioMed Alliance, Patient Organisations and IPCAA
- *This consolidation exercise has demonstrated that it is impossible to merge 3 Codes without any changes
 - *These changes have been limited to what is absolutely necessary and well established in the current practices



Stakeholders feedback

Objectives: information before finalization and give the opportunity to share any concerns before the Board approval

* Feedback received from: BioMed Alliance, European Men Health Forum, Mental Health Europe, IPCAA

***** Overall positive

- * MHE welcomes some changes (among others, the inclusion of PO's representatives, the alignment on disclosure reporting period and the recommendation to create disclosure gateways).
- * Nevertheless, the association expresses its regret to see that <u>Patients are outside of the disclosure's scope</u>. Additionally, MHE believes that pharmaceutical companies should not have input in the content of <u>medical education</u> because it creates a direct <u>conflict of interest and a risk of bias</u> in education provided to HCPs.



Changes introduced to simplify the concepts

Objective: better concept alignment and promote the common understanding of the Code by stakeholders and general public aiming to improve adherence

- * Introduction of <u>common definitions</u>
 - * HCP definition extended to any public officials
- * Integration of the EFPIA Ethical Principles in the introduction
- * Definition of a <u>new structure</u> to cover all type of interactions and bring clarity on the interactions:
 - * Common principles for interactions with HCPs/HCOs/POs
 - * Specific requirements for interactions with HCPs and HCOs or POs
- * All the relevant existing guidance have been integrated into the Annexes
- * Removal of the <u>repetitive provisions</u>



Changes introduced to clarify the content

During the revision of the 3 Codes, some principles or requirements have been changed after a deep analysis of the consequences

- * Extension of the gift prohibition to POs and their representatives
- * Extension to HCOs of the principles applicable to company funding
- * Distinction of sponsorship provided to HCOs and contribution to costs of events provided to HCPs
- * Introduction of an article related to Medical Education
- * Prohibition of product branded for IEM and IMU (IFPMA wording)
- * In the disclosure requirements, removal of the references to the consent



Next steps

- *Submission to the General Assembly on 27 June 2019
- *Member Associations' transposition in one year delay (i.e. June 2020)
 - *Implementation at the latest in January 2021
- * Development of a communication plan
