- Volonteer based:
  - Officers and Faculty members provide uncompensated services




## Compliance for ESOT

Compliance to ethics should be intrinsic in the vision of any medical association

- Reinforce the reputation for quality and innovation and create a competitive edge based that differentiate the organization
- Full independence in education program planning. Pharma has no influence on content and/or execution
- Activities are conducted according to established compliance guidelines and with adequate documentation
- Officers are elected with a democratic process by the membership
- Hospitality for Officers and Faculty is ruled by internal policies, in compliance to EU Directive and various recommendations



## Challenges: association perspective

- Many players: the higher the level the smaller the dialogue. Level the play field
- There is an urgent need for pharma to win public perception which may lead to drastic measures
- Impact on activities: long(er)-term planning, attendance decline, discriminating professional roles (non-prescribing)
- Adverse effects on: faculty recruitment, commitment & motivation = on CME

- High quality content based activities become preferred choice of the various stakeholders
- Innovate and consider new formats and deliverables suitable for support
- Companies are shifting budgets from marketing to education
- Associations can play a leading role to help with disclosure requirements
