

Who is URAC?

- Nonprofit, independent organization founded in 1990 originally chartered to accredit utilization review services
- URAC offers more than 30 accreditation and certification programs across the entire continuum of care
- URAC currently accredits more than 600 programs operating in all 50 states
- Government references to URAC accreditation appear in statutes, regulations, agency publications, Requests for Proposals, and contract language
- URAC is now recognized by 48 states, District of Columbia, and five federal agencies (OPM, DOD, VA, CMS, and DOL)

Why URAC?

- Industry was looking for an alternative
- Core philosophy of URAC is educational with non prescriptive approach
- URAC PCHCH Program is patient centric vs. emphasis on EHR and meaningful use
- Design supports a stepwise approach for transformation of a practice to a patient centered health care home
- Option to apply for achievement or achievement with EHR recognition (phase in option)
- Standards focus on access and coordination of care
- Resources available for practices to use tools such as selfassessment checklist and Primer for tracking progress
- Review by professional clinician-consultative interaction
- Tiered pricing based on # of clinicians in practice

URAC Patient Centered Health Care Home Overview

Began development March 2010.



Health Care Accreditation Continuum


