- 4-year multipayer model launched by CMS in October 2012 to test advanced primary care
 - Risk-stratified care management
 - Improved access and continuity of care
 - Planned care for chronic conditions and preventive care
 - Patient and caregiver engagement
 - Coordination of care across the medical neighborhood
 - Annual milestones to promote these functions

CMS + 31 payers

- Provide capital through care-management fees and incentives through shared savings
- Share quarterly feedback reports and data files
- Provide technical assistance and collaborative learning networks

Overview of CPC (continued)

- 7 regions: AR, CO, OH/KY, OK, OR, NJ, NY
- 497 primary care practices (978 applied)
- 2,100 clinicians (~4.4/practice)
- Attributed patients: 330,000 Medicare FFS patients, 1.3 million covered by other payers, untold others
- Mixed methods evaluation
- Examining effects on implementation; quality, cost and use; and patient, clinician, staff experience; and implications for spread
