A Driver of Transformation





Colorado	New York	North Carolina
The Colorado Accountable Care Collaborative is a statewide Medicaid initiative working to improve outcomes through coordinated care. The initiative is reducing inappropriate hospital and ER utilization, having an impact on Medicaid's total cost-of-care. The Colorado All-Payer Claims Database, administered by CIVHC, brings together comprehensive healthcare information from multiple sources, providing a holistic view of the care provided throughout the state.	The Adirondack Medical Home Demonstration, one of eight Multi-Payer Advanced Primary Care Practice (MAPCP) demonstration projects sponsored by CMS, has implemented a patient-centered medical home that involves providers, payers and state government collaborating to transform the way they provide and organize care for the chronically ill across a four-county area. It is an example of how multipayer platforms can drive program evaluation and program management.	One of the oldest Medical homes in the country, Community Care of North Carolina has 14 community care networks that cover the entire state and enroll over one million Medicaid recipients. Between 2007-2010, the program has seen decreased utilization of ER visits and inpatient admissions and increased utilization of primary care visits and pharmacy use.
