## **Brief description**

- Target population/community: DC community.
- Health issue or condition that is the focus of the project/collaborative: 4 priority areas identified via the 2013 community health needs assessment: asthma, obesity, sexual health, and substance abuse/mental health.
- Main strategies used by the project/collaborative: The DCHCC adopted an action-planning model developed at Children's National Health System, *Lead- Collaborate- Support*, to identify clear roles and responsibilities for each Collaborative partner in relation to its resources and capacity to advance work on an issue deemed to be a high priority.
  - Lead: An organization in this role commits to seeing that the issue is addressed and takes responsibility for developing the resources needed to advance the issue.
  - Collaborate: An organization in this role commits to significant help in advancing the issue and will participate regularly in developing strategy to advance the issue.
  - Support: An organization in this role commits to helping with specific circumscribed tasks when asked.

In the *Lead- Collaborate- Support* model, every institution has a role. Role identification is critical to internal capacity alignment of resources and operations, and external relationship building, engagement, and sustainability.

- Partners/Sectors that are part of the project/collaborative: Ex-officio and board members representing several social determinants of health, local government, health- and other related community-based organizations
- Duration/when it was initiated: DCHCC was formed in January 2012.

## Relevance of project to this breakout session

The DCHCC is a sound example of collaboration in needs assessment and implementation efforts.

## **Results/outcomes**

The two principal products of the DCHCC are a community health needs assessment and a community health improvement plan.
