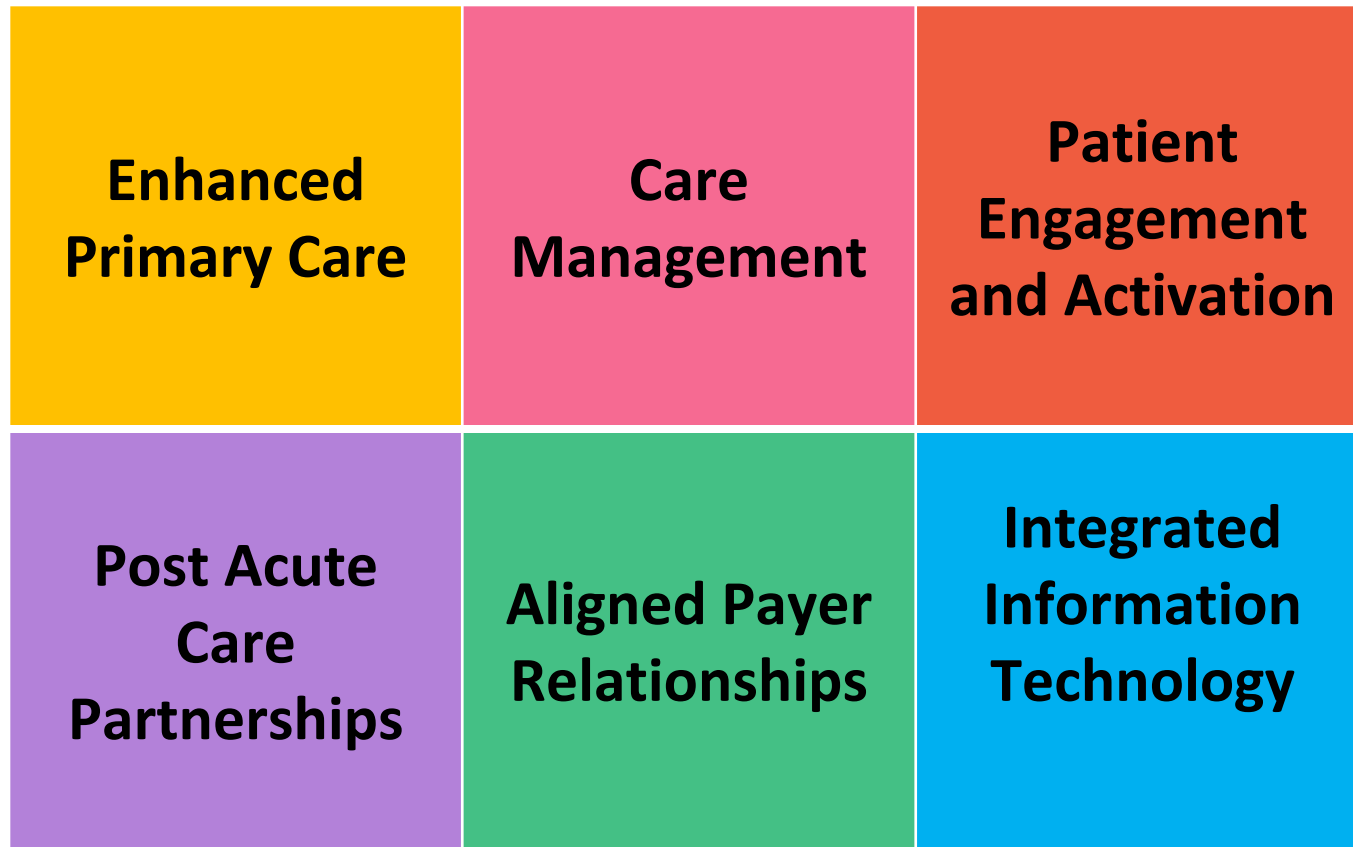

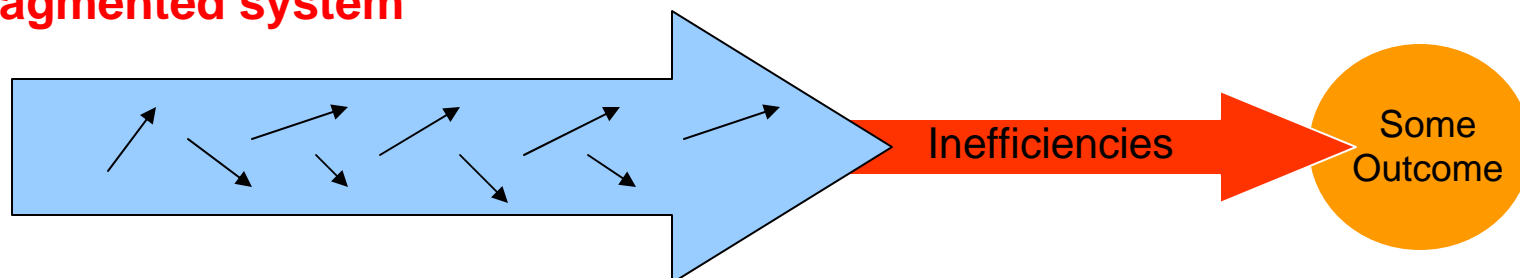


Health Delivery System Transformation Focus Areas

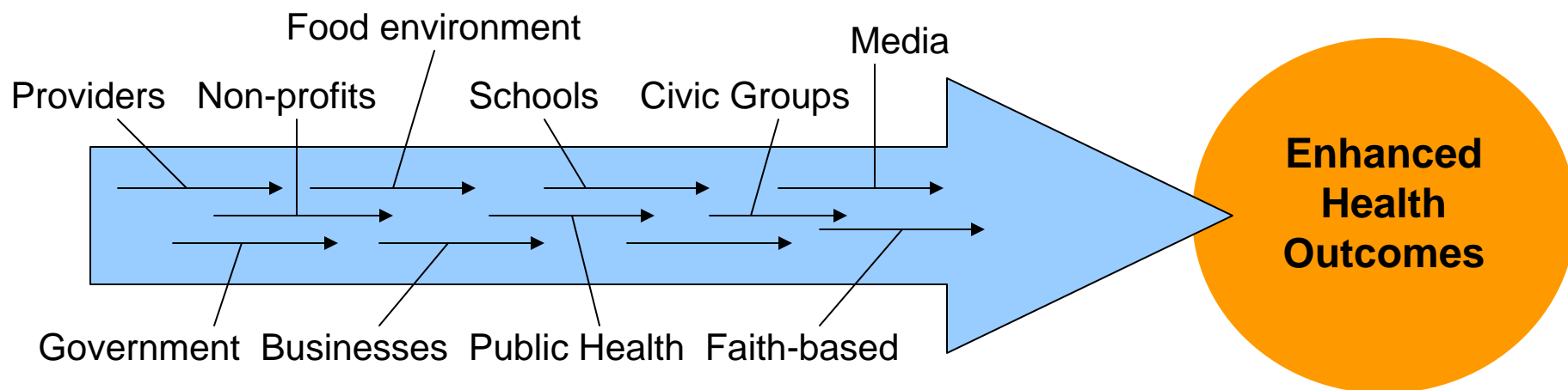
